Greasby Infant School Pre-School Admission Criteria

Greasby Infant School Pre-school is managed by Greasby Infant School and its Governing Body. All children will be considered for a pre-school place the term after they turn 3 years old – September 1st, January 1st, April 1st. Starting dates for the terms will fall in-line with school calendar dates.

We are able to offer 16 places in our morning session; 16 places in lunch club and 16 places in the afternoon sessions. We hold computerised waiting lists for these places.

If there are more applications than there are places available, then eligibility will be determined in accordance with the following scheme of priorities and in order of application on the waiting list:

- Children in care, and children who were in care but have been adopted or are subject to a residency order or special guardianship order (“previously in care”)
- Then in the following priority order:

1. Children who already have older brothers or sisters (including half or step siblings living in the same household) at the school when they are due to start. We will also treat a brother or sister at Greasby Junior School as a sibling.

2. Children in the schools catchment zone in order of application.

3. Children outside the catchment area in order of application.

In addition the Governing Body has the following guidelines with respect to applications to the pre-school:

- Families are asked via the Pre-School Application form, to indicate their preferences for a maximum of 5 sessions e.g. mornings, afternoons, split weeks. The school will do all it can to meet these preferences so long as there are places available. After all allocations have been given, any remaining sessions will be offered out on a first come first serve basis and a waiting list formed from this if needed.
- The Governing Body will consider exceptional applications strictly on a case by case basis and they reserve the right, in their sole discretion, to alter and/or amend any of the criteria above in any circumstances that they deem fit. (An example of which, without limitation to the generality of this provision, would be where a circumstance is considered a health and safety risk to any member of staff and/or children).

Key Information

Our Sessions

We offer two main sessions a day, during term time only. We aim to be as flexible as possible to accommodate parents' varying needs, do not hesitate to speak to a member of the team.

The morning session runs from 8:45am – 11:45am.

The afternoon session runs from 12:30pm – 3:30pm.

Lunch club is available 11:45am – 12:30pm at an additional cost of £4. Children may bring a lunch box or purchase a hot dinner for £3.00.

Children may do any combination of sessions to suit (spaces permitting).

There is no wraparound care for preschool currently available.

Funding and fees

From September 2025 in England, working parents of children aged 9 months and older can get 30 hours of government-funded childcare per week for 38 weeks of the year. All 3 and 4-year-olds are also entitled to 15 hours of funded early education. To receive the 30 hours, parents must be working, meet minimum income requirements, and apply online via the GOV.UK website, and reconfirm their eligibility every three months.

All sessions not covered by EYE are charged at £18 per session.

Any sessions not funded can be paid through the tax free childcare account or bank transfer.

Any charged sessions will be invoiced before the half term to then be paid by the end of that term. All charges for previous terms must be paid before the next term commences to allow the children to keep attending sessions. In the event a bank holiday doesn't fall within a school holiday, the session will still be charged as usual.

Any charged sessions must be paid for even if the child is off for illness, appointments or holidays. If there is going to be a continuous period of absence of more than 3 weeks then please inform the setting to discuss options.

A four week notice period must be given for the reduction of sessions or leaving the pre-school.
