Trips & Visits

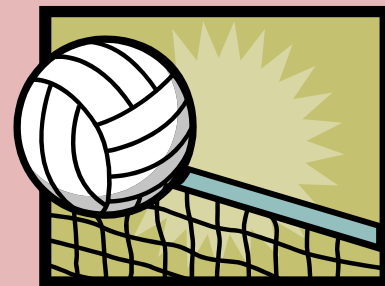

Please encourage your child to complete their homework neatly and independently where possible.

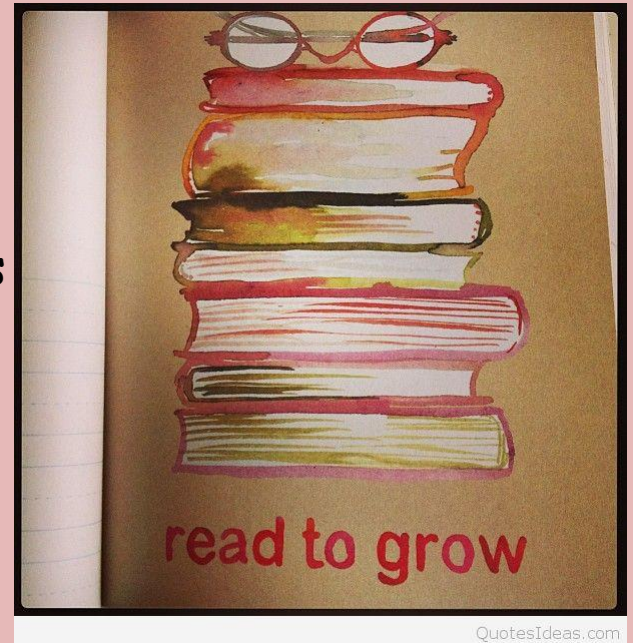
Reading in year 1.

Phonics Screening Check

The Phonics Screening Check takes place in May/June 2027.

It is a national reading test to assess your child's reading ability. They are asked to read a combination of real and 'alien' (nonsense) words.

All children will be well prepared and are usually unaware they are taking the test.

More information and practice materials will be sent home closer to the time 😊.
